SAY NO TO HAZING!!!!!!!

HAZING IS A DANGEROUS EPIDEMIC THAT IS SWEEPING THROUGH OUR NATION. DO YOUR PART TO ENSURE THAT NO ONE GETS HURT OR EMBARASSED JUST TO BE A PART OF THIS TEAM. THERE IS NO ROOM FOR HAZING WHEN IT COMES TO BASKETBALL. IF YOU HAVE TIME FOR HAZING YOU COULD SPEND IT WORKING ON SCHOOLWORK, IMPROVING YOUR BASKETBALL SKILLS, OR GETTING REST.

EXAMPLES OF HAZING:

- Any form of physical harm (beatings, slaps, or sexual misconduct)
- Withholding food or water at any time

With this in mind there are a few traditions that may be kept. They may include having underclassmen carrying bags and upperclassman being allowed to go first in getting food and choosing sweats.

HAZING WILL <u>NOT</u> BE TOLERATED!

This is a flyer that I would present to the school board about hazing. It gives a clear definition of hazing as well as examples of inappropriate and acceptable behaviors. I would encourage all of my athletes to keep this in the front of their basketball binders as well as having it posted in the locker room and gymnasium. There would be a zero tolerance policy in which all offenders would be dealt with the same way. First offense would be suspension for 25% of the season's games, second offense would be 50% of a season's games and third offense would result in removal from the team. These offenses would carryover from year to year, meaning that if an athlete took part in hazing has a freshman, sophomore, and junior that athlete would be kicked off the team and not allowed to come out as a senior. It is important to understand just how dangerous hazing can be. The more that we tolerate hazing now the worse it will get in the future. It is important that coaches take a stand and stop hazing before it starts.
